Frequently Asked Questions

1. How does the online class work?

All chapters have a recorded online lecture. The student downloads & prints the video notes. The student takes notes while watching the video, and can go back to review at any time.

A suggested schedule will be made available as well as additional worksheets with answers to the Parent-Teacher via a cloud-based service. The beauty of this course is the Parent-Teacher sets the pace for the course based on student needs. You have access to the course for 365 days. You are in control of your student's schedule.

On test day, the student open the link to the test using a secure key code provided to the Parent-Teacher who administers the test. A grade for the test is available once the student submits the test.

2. Who should take the online course?

Homeschool families need flexible schedules due to heavy activity commitments in sports, forensics, or the arts. Weekly tutorials can be difficult to manage during the competitive or performance season. With online classes, Parent-Teachers can adjust as necessary. Students work at a pace you, as the Parent-Teacher designates for your student(s).

Classes are also priced to meet most homeschool budgets.

3. Who should **not** take the online course?

Students who must have a third party tutor to stay on task.

4. What are LabDays?

LabDays on live learning sessions. A full high school lab science credit is earned in two – eight hour sessions. All the lab materials are provided in the fee. LabDay schedules are set due to the facility. The location is Gymstars Gymnastics, 435 Washington Street, Collierville, Tennessee.

5. Do I have to take the online class and LabDays together?

No. It is highly recommended that you take the online course and LabDays together; however, you may choose to purchase only one product.

6. Do you grade my student's work?

No. However, a suggested grading plan and free online grading service will be suggested to you. Currently, the engrade.com site used by many tutorials was purchased by McGraw Hill and will not be available as a free service. I am planning a grading system for LabDays – for right now, it's in the works.

7. What do the online classes and LabDays cost?

The online classes are \$99 for each student and LabDay sessions are \$199 per student for two sessions. Payments via debit or credit card are made online in the site store.

8. Are refunds available?

No.

9. What supplies are needed?

The only supplies are what you would need at home to take the course. If you are taking chemistry, each student should have a TI-84 calculator for the homework and LabDays. This calculator is also a great tool for the ACT and SAT exams.

10. What books are necessary?

In classroom tutorials, I have used Apologia curriculum. The online course will be set up by topic. Therefore, if you choose another curriculum, it should work with the online videos and tests.
